## **5. Oral Report Items**

### **A. Update No. 3 – North County Corridor Project Study Report**

StanCOG Executive Director Vince Harris gave a brief overview of the North County Corridor Project and introduced Chris Balaji, Project Manager from Jacobs Carter Burgess Consulting. Mr. Balaji updated the Committee on the completion of the Project Study Report (PSR) and commended the cities of Oakdale, Modesto, and Riverbank, the County of Stanislaus, Caltrans and StanCOG for their cooperation on the project. Stan Risen stated that the County will have the Joint Powers Agreement in its final form by April 7, and it will be signed within 60 days. He added that Stanislaus County Public Works Director Mat Machado will be the Project Manager. Mr. Balaji outlined the next steps in the process, and stressed the importance of keeping the project moving as quickly as possible toward construction.

By Motion (Chase-Brinton) and unanimous vote, the Technical Advisory Committee recommended that the Policy Board accept the North County Corridor Project Study Report and direct staff to begin work on the Project Approval and Environmental Document, as the next phase of project development for the North County Corridor Project.

Carlos Yamzon summarized the FTIP Amendment for the Committee. Amended Transit Claim: County of Stanislaus

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**Recommendation**

BY MOTION, recommend that the Policy Board approve FY 2007/08 Transportation Development Act (TDA) Fund amended transit claim for the County of Stanislaus, as submitted to StanCOG.

**Background**

On November 14, 2007, the StanCOG Policy apportioned additional State Transit Assistance (STA) funds to the City of Modesto, the City of Turlock, and the County of Stanislaus. The County of Stanislaus has now submitted its amended transit claim #2 to reflect this action.

**Discussion**

The revised apportionment increased the County of Stanislaus' STA from \$6,904 to \$13,752, for an \$6,848 increase. Accordingly, the additional STA apportionment reduced the County of Stanislaus' Local Transportation Fund (LTF) apportionment by \$6,848.

The required findings for the County of Stanislaus' claim were previously made on June 13, 2007.

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### **Recommendation**

By Motion, recommend that the Policy Board approve the Riverbank Oakdale Transit Authority's request for exemption from Transportation Development Act farebox ratio requirements through fiscal year 2009/10.

### **Background**

As mandated by the Transportation Development Act (TDA), each transit operator that receives TDA funds is required to meet certain ridership revenue-generating goals. The primary goal is the "farebox" recovery ratio, which is the ratio of fare revenues collected divided by the operating cost of the system. Different transit systems have different farebox ratio % requirements (usually based on the population base they serve). For the Riverbank Oakdale Transit Authority (ROTA) this farebox ratio is 10%.

### **Discussion**

Although the farebox ratio is set at 10% for the Riverbank Oakdale Transit Authority, TDA regulations allow for certain exemptions from these minimum farebox requirements. Transit operators who significantly expand services (e.g. increase geographical service area, routes, or hours of operation, or increase service frequency 'headways' greater than 25%) can request a two-year exemption from farebox ratio

requirements. Effective January 1, 2008, ROTA implemented a redesign of two trolley routes within, and between, the cities of Riverbank and Oakdale (see attached). The route revision increases route frequency from 1 hour to 30 minutes for routes within each city, and adds an Express Bus for provision of services between the two cities.

The implementation of the new routes also included an increase in fares. The trolley fares were increased to \$1.00 within each city and \$.25 transfer fare for the Express Bus for general public and \$.50 for seniors. The Dial-a-Ride service was increased to \$2.00 for general public and \$1.50 for seniors.

#### Opinion of Caltrans, Division of Mass Transit

The ROTA request for farebox exemption was reviewed by Caltrans, Division of Mass Transit with the following response:

“Based on the documentation submitted to my office April 22, 2008, the Riverbank Oakdale Transit Authority is exempt from required ratios through the 2009/2010 fiscal year.

PUC Section 99268.8 allows exemption of fare box ratio requirements for newly established services or expansion of services. Riverbank Oakdale Transit Authority qualifies under two stipulations: frequency of service and an addition of a new type of service (Express Trolley Buses)”

**Riverbank Oakdale Transit Authority**  
**Request for an exemption to the Transportation Development Act fare box ratio Requirement.**

The Riverbank Oakdale Transit Authority (ROTA) began fixed route service in June 2004. The first full fiscal year of service was in the 2004/05 fiscal year. It is under or understanding that the Transportation Development Act Fund provides for a two year exemption from the fare box ratio.

The fiscal year 06/07 would have been the first year that ROTA would have been required to meet the fare box Ratio of 10%. As a result of ongoing issues with its contracted service provider the fare box ratio was 8%.

On October 1, 2007 ROTA contracted with a new service provider although at substantial additional cost. On January 1, 2008 ROTA instituted a change in its fixed route system.

Since the inception of the fixed route system provided for 2 trolley buses on one hour routes within the City's of Riverbank and Oakdale and between the two Cities. On January 1, 2008 a redesign of the routes was implemented with two 30 minutes routes within each City with a trolley bus staying within each City and an Express Trolley Bus between the two Cities.

The implementation of the new routes also included a rate increase in Fares. The trolley fares were increase to \$1.00 within each City, a \$.25 transfer fare for the express for general public and a \$.50 senior. The dial a ride service was increase to \$2.00 for general public and \$1.50 for seniors.

The change in service providers has been well received by the riding public. Because of the issues prior to the change in service providers it has taken several months of extensive outreach into the communities to get the public to ride the system, we have began to see some significant increases in ridership.

We are requesting that ROTA be exempt from the Fare box ratio requirement through 2009/10 fiscal year.

SUBJECT: StanCOG as Sponsor and Implementing Agency for State Route 132 Expressway Project Status Report (PSR) and Project Approval and Environmental Document (PA&ED) Phase

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**Recommendation**

**By Motion**, recommend that the Policy Board direct staff to continue project development activities with StanCOG as the Sponsor and Implementing Agency for the State Route (SR) 132 Expressway Project for the Project Study Report (PSR) and Project Approval and Environmental Document (PA&ED) Phase.

**Background**

In a letter to Mark Leja, former Caltrans District 10 Director, dated September 8, 2003, the Route 132 Plan Implementation Project (PIP) Team requested the consolidation of the Caltrans design teams working on the SR-132 West and SR-132 East projects, based on connectivity issues that were apparent but were not being resolved as a result of the separate project development teams. With this action, work on the SR-132 West Expressway was suspended, and with eventual Federal Earmark funding, StanCOG began and completed the activities leading to the SR 132 East / West Connectivity Study.

As the lead agency for the SR 132 East / West Feasibility Study, StanCOG in a joint effort with the City of Modesto, Stanislaus County, Caltrans, elected officials, community groups and the general public, has completed the study which would set the various strategies for the next series of project development activities.

This proposed project will construct a four (4) lane expressway in combination with a four (4) to six (6) lane arterial street to reroute SR 132 away from downtown extending east/west, south of Kansas Avenue, from SR-99 to approximately Dakota Avenue to the east. This is the Caltrans SR 132 West Expressway project. This will be the first of several phases of a project that will eventually construct a new SR 132/SR-99 interchange, one way couplets on 5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> Streets, and a new interchange in the approximate vicinity of the Tuolumne Blvd. interchange. This eastern connection with SR 99 will be complemented by a series of local street network improvements connecting to the extension of SR 132 / D Street and Yosemite Blvd.

## **Discussion**

With the momentum started by completion of the SR-132 East / West Feasibility Study, StanCOG staff is recommending that the agency continue as the sponsor and implementing agency for the next phases of project development, immediately moving into the Project Study Report (PSR) and Project Report and Environmental Document (PA&ED) activities. This recommendation is based on factors that are related to federal, state, regional and local priorities and resources. To supplement available Regional Improvement Program (RIP) funding, the availability of federal earmark funding from Congressman Dennis Cardoza is the catalyst that allows StanCOG to sustain a continued level of progressive, project development activities.

There are several advantages for StanCOG to maintain the lead agency status for the project. Aside from the agency's direct responsibility for administration of state and federal funding, StanCOG has also recently demonstrated successful fiduciary responsibility on current project management activities including the aforementioned Feasibility Study for SR-132, completed on budget, the North County Corridor (NCC) Feasibility Study, completed on time and under budget, and the recent NCC Project Study Report (PSR) completed on budget and within its target time frame of three and half months. Additionally, because Caltrans does not have available technical staffing resources to work on this project in Fiscal Year 2008-09, as the lead agency, StanCOG will hire and manage consultant activities for the PSR and PA&ED. This direct responsibility and oversight will lead to increased accountability of project activities, schedule progress, and invoicing.

As the project sponsor, StanCOG already has an established stakeholder oversight committee in the form of the 132 PIP team, which it will maintain through the subsequent project development phases. The process of consensus building which was an important part of the success of the SR-132 Feasibility Study, will continue in the oversight process for the continued phases of project development.

The primary challenge to StanCOG as an implementing agency is the reimbursement process associated with federal funding. This is not expected to be an issue in the initial phases of project development but will need to be planned for in the construction phase wherein larger amounts of invoice payment may present a cash flow issue.

Lastly, in reiteration of the increased accountability associated with its lead agency status, it will further enhance StanCOG's true involvement, commitment and visibility in improving mobility and enhancing safety in transportation, in the Stanislaus County region.

## **Action**

By motion, recommend that the Policy Board approve the 2007 Federal Transportation Improvement Program Amendment #11 (Type 3 Formal Amendment).

**Background**

As the designated Metropolitan Planning Organization, for the Stanislaus Region, StanCOG is responsible for managing state and federal funds through a document called the Federal Transportation Improvement Program, or FTIP. This document contains the entire list of projects to which state and federal funds have been awarded through StanCOG, CalTrans, or other grantor agencies. The Policy Board adopted the latest version of the FTIP on May 9, 2007. Occasionally, this document must be amended to add new projects, modify project descriptions or funding amounts, change program-funding year, or delete existing projects.

The projects contained herein are presented to the Technical Advisory Committee and a motion for recommendation to the Policy Board to approve Amendment #11 is being requested.

**AMEND THE FOLLOWING PROJECTS:**

1. Federal Transit Administration Section 5307 Program (FTA 5307): City of Modesto requests to amend the FY 2007 FTIP to include the following new projects:

The City of Modesto's Area Express Transit (MAX) is relocating its administrative offices as part of a larger reorganization at the Stanislaus County/City of Modesto Governmental Center building. In an effort to expedite relocating the MAX administrative offices and necessary renovations, the City requests to add the following dollar amounts to be incorporated into the FTA 5307 program:

### Background

The goal of the three-year (2005/06 - 2007/08) Blueprint Process is to develop a 2050 vision for the San Joaquin Valley that is created and shared by its residents. The San Joaquin Valley Regional Blueprint will formulate an approach to long-term regional planning that addresses land use, housing, transportation, environmental issues, and economic development interests in the San Joaquin Valley. This approach will develop and examine alternative scenarios and identify a "preferred scenario".

### Blueprint Vision Statement

The Stanislaus County Blueprint Vision Statement was adopted by the StanCOG Policy Board at their February 13, 2008 meeting. The Vision Statement contains eight guiding principles/themes to be followed throughout the Blueprint Planning process:

*"Establishment of a comprehensive innovative planning process that will accomplish our core values, and assure a quality of life, prosperity, equality, and economic opportunity for future generations"*

### Discussion

#### Blueprint Activities

- Planning Directors from the cities and the County of Stanislaus are providing valuable input into the local Blueprint Planning process. To assure accuracy of the

respective jurisdictions' Blueprint future growth projections, the Planning Directors are commenting on the Blueprint "2050 No Change" scenario. This scenario projects growth of each of the cities based upon growth patterns from 1990 to the present. Once completed, the "No Change" scenario will provide the basis for alternative growth strategies.

- Blueprint 2008 Executive Forum – Local elected officials from throughout the San Joaquin Valley will meet in Fresno on April 25<sup>th</sup> to engage in a full discussion regarding Regional Blueprint activities.
- StanCOG staff is working with the consulting firm of Moore Iacofano Goldsmith (MIG) on Phase II of public outreach for the Regional Blueprint Planning process. Public Workshops addressing alternative growth scenarios will be presented and discussed in an audience participation format, which will include members of each City Council as well as local planning commissioners. Blueprint Workshops will begin the last week of May and proceed through the month of June. The goal of the Workshops will be the support of a "locally endorsed" Blueprint growth scenario. Upon completion of the Workshops, the results of the Workshops will be reviewed by the county Planning Directors and the StanCOG Advisory Committees. Presentation of the Preferred Local Alternative is scheduled for the August StanCOG Policy Board meeting.
- The Blueprint Web Site [ValleyBlueprint.org](http://ValleyBlueprint.org), contains the latest information on the Valley wide Blueprint planning effort
- The San Joaquin Valley Regional Blueprint has been approved for \$1.375 million for a 3<sup>rd</sup> year of Blueprint activities. The 3<sup>rd</sup> year will focus on implementation of the the Blueprint goals and guiding principles.
